Drugs Awareness

PCSO Phil Wright came to talk to us about legal and illegal drugs. Beth said: 'He brought in some of the drugs in little pots to show us what they looked like' and Evie said: 'This increased our visual awareness.' 'He told us what happens to your body after taking drugs and what reactions you might have and how to recognise people who have just taken drugs so we can keep ourselves safe.' Matilda said: 'He showed us what methods people use to take drugs, the risks and how people hide them from the police too.' Reuben, Archie and Oliver said: 'We feel really prepared for life at secondary school because we know what the drugs look like, how people react after taking them and all about the risks associated with drug taking.' Loukas said: 'Legal drugs can cause harm to your body too if you take too many, like paracetamol. You have to be a certain age to take some legal drugs. Some drugs have been designed for horses before they race but people still use them.'
