It was great to see so many families at the workshops. Tim's key messages were 'We have to remember it is the behaviour not the technology that is the problem' and 'the most important way to support your child in the digital world is to talk to them. It is now a key aspect of how to be a positive parent.' Make sure screen time is time limited and get technology out of the bedroom. He also advised having digital family time when you have conversations with your children ask them to explain how the apps work. Advice on Roblox, Snapchat, Live.ly and Musical.ly was shared. Other families shared experiences about 'House Party.' The children were keen to share their knowledge with Tim. He spoke about crossing the police line in a digital world and putting yourself in danger. He also made them think about the number of 'friends' they have online and making 'friend' requests and about the consequences of giving out information. We celebrated the great fun that is the online world - we just need to remember and put into practice how to keep ourselves safe.
