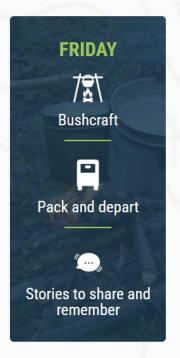
Example Itinerary











What learning will take place?

Meals at the centre

- Monday no packed lunch is required (this is provided by the centre when we get there)
- Breakfast cooked and cereals/ toast
- Lunches will be sandwiches, crisps, biscuits, fruit etc
- Dinners selection of mains and dessert
- Tuck shop available no more than £5.00 spending money

Where will I sleep?

Accommodation

For students:

- Can sleep up to 120 students
- Rooms accommodate 4 to 12 people
- Dormitory blocks accommodate 8 to 28 people and often are made up of a range of room sizes
- All bedding included (pillows, duvets, extra blankets, etc.)
- Dedicated toilet and bathroom facilities for each dormitory
- Accessible suite for additional needs





What will you need?

The courses at the centre involve a lot of time outdoors, whatever the weather. Therefore, there is a likelihood of clothes getting wet.

Hard-wearing, warm clothes are required!

DON'T buy new clothes for the trip!

Clothes for the activities

FOR OUT ON ACTIVITY

- •Old Trainers that can get muddy
- Clean shoes/trainers for the evening
- Wellington boots
- •Warm/waterproof gloves or mitts, warm hat, scarf/buff/snood and/or sun hat
- •Waterproof jacket or coat (you will be provided with a full set of waterproofs when you get here too but it is nice to have your own)
- •3 to 4 Warm shirts / T-shirts / thermal tops (avoid cotton)
- •3 to 4 Long sleeved fleece/hoodie/jumper/warm top
- Swimwear
- Several changes of underwear
- •3 to 4 trousers (<u>no jeans</u>), tracksuit bottoms or doubled-up leggings are ideal
- •3 Pairs thick socks
- •3 Pairs thin socks (not short trainers socks)

FOR EVENINGS / WHEN NOT OUT ON ACTIVITY

- Socks for the evening, when not on activities
- Casual clothes

East Barnby will provide waterproof trousers and a top, wellington boots, walking boots and wetsuits (if required).

Please do not go and buy these new!

Other essentials

- 2 Good-sized towels
- Drinks Bottle (1 litre minimum)
- Plasters for blisters
- Toiletries
- Personal medication
- In summer: Sun block (factor 30 minimum), and a sun hat

Useful Items

- Torch + spare batteries
- Small daysack
- Writing materials
- Lypsyl or lip salve
- 2 to 3 Black bin liners
- Flip Flops (for the shower)
- Books/playing cards
- Cuddly Toy
- Sunglasses (in summer)

Please note that aerosol deodorants are not allowed at the centre.

Please bring a suitable alternative.

Please make sure that your name is on your clothing and personal possessions – this is especially important for medication such as inhalers.

Please do not bring any technology - mobile phones, smart watches, i-pods, etc.
This will be confiscated.

The Gift Shop

£5 is sufficient to bring, as spending money. Sweets and gifts are available from the Tuck Shop costing between 50p - £5.

Students may bring small change for the tuck shop (preferably change).
